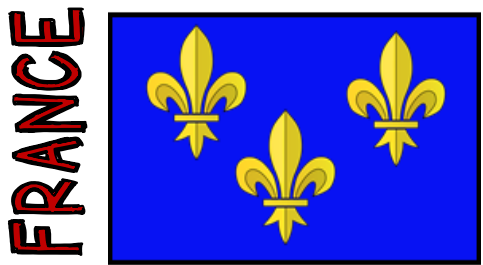

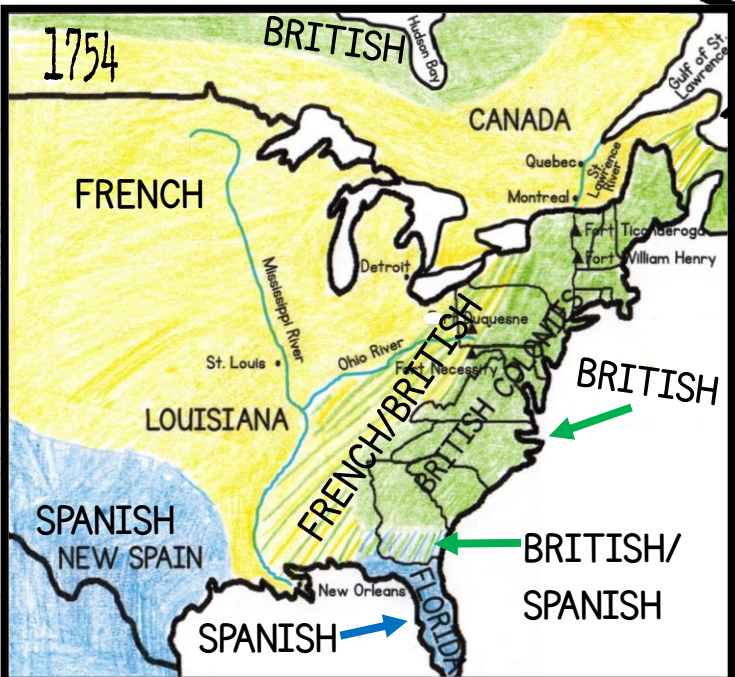
Great Britain and their Native American allies (Iroquois Confederacy, Cherokee, Catawba)

**WHERE:**

British territory in North America and New France

Why was it so important for the colonial powers to claim the waterways?  
The waterways connected settlements, distributed goods and people throughout the area. Because of this, control over a significant waterway increased the colonial power's economic and military strength.



**MAIN CAUSE:**

France and Great Britain both claimed control over areas in North America including the Ohio River Valley, Mississippi River basin, and Great Lakes region.

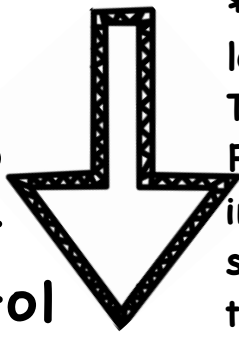
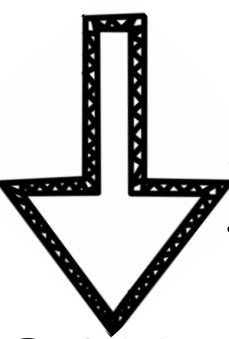
## Treaty of Paris of 1763 ends the war

## EFFECTS:

- \*France lost its territory in North America
- \*Great Britain increased its territory in North America, including gaining Florida
- \*Native Americans continued to fight against British control
- \*Great Britain's large war debt led to laws like the Sugar Act. These laws along with the Proclamation of 1763 and the increased presence of British soldiers led to resistance among the American colonies
